

Follow the instructions given below to make a noun tree





Multiples Garden:


Choose a number between 8 and 12. Draw a flower for each multiple of that number up to 100.


Factors Garden:

Pick a number between 10 and 50. Draw a flower pot for that number. Each leaf on the plant growing from the pot should contain a factor of that number. Example: For 24, leaves might be 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, 12, 24. Color and decorate each pot and leaf.

Creative Touch: Add bees, butterflies, or ladybugs with math tips (e.g., "Factors are numbers that divide exactly!"). Give your garden a name (e.g., "The Magical Math Garden)


